Pilgrimage to Montgomery, AL October 6-10, 2022

Registration is now open for our Pilgrimage to Montgomery, Alabama October 6-10, 2022. We hope that you will join us as we travel as a community to deliver the soil representing the lives of Joseph McCoy and Benjamin Thomas to a final resting place at the Equal Justice Initiative's National Memorial for Peace and Justice.



The trip will focus on the history and legacy of racial terror in this country, as well as the struggle for social justice. In addition to experiencing the Memorial for Peace and Justice and EJI's Legacy Museum, participants will tour civil rights sites in both Montgomery and Selma and hear first-hand accounts from civil rights activists from these communities. October 6 and 10 are travel days, with the program taking place October 7, 8, and 9.

The ACRP pilgrimage includes chartered buses to and from Montgomery, Alabama (participants are

encouraged to travel with the community by bus, but there are a limited number of self-travel slots available on a first-come basis), discounted hotel stays, curated social justice tours, most meals and evening programs with guest speakers. Read the entire itinerary. Register Now!

In collaboration with the Equal Justice Initiative, ACRP will hold a formal Soil Collection Ceremony to memorialize Joseph McCoy and Benjamin Thomas on Saturday, September 24, at 4 p.m. on Market Square. By collecting soil that represents their lives, as well as the rich heritage and contributions of Alexandria's African American community, McCoy and Thomas will be honored and remembered. Labeled jars will be taken to EJI as part of the Pilgrimage in October. Additional jars will remain in Alexandria at the Alexandria Black History Museum.
